

Introduction To Bisconti Tags

Each Bisconti tag references, directly and indirectly, an encyclopedia of tables. Here is a portion of Scripture containing the Bisconti tag *Radon* followed by a portion of its first-level table:

The table provides information about every Bible version in existence. The Variables column tells us, among other things, how many second-level tables there are. The entire set of Radon tables, which encompass 153 levels with 2,377 tables, defines every variant form and variant meaning, both documented and permutationally projected. Permutational projection would be, for example, taking the letters “a,” “b,” and “c” and forming combinations “ab,” “ac,” “bc,” and “abc” then filtering out existing permutations (existing texts) leaving, for example, only “bc.”
